Requirements

The Essay

The essay is judged on content, but we expect appropriate grammar and spelling. Use a separate sheet of paper for your essay, please type and do not exceed the specified word limit.

Topic

Aviation - where did your interest originate? Are there any individuals, events, or life experiences that have led you in this direction? What are your goals in aviation? How do you plan to use this scholarship to reach your goals? How do you plan to finance the flight training that this scholarship does not cover? (Maximum 500 words).

General Information

Please read and follow all instructions carefully, they are intended to provide a fair and consistent assessment process for all candidates.

The application will be judged on merit, including scholastic achievement, leadership skills, and community involvement. The applicant's ability to express his/her passion for flight is integral to the evaluation process. Applications submitted incorrectly or incomplete will be eliminated.

Flight training - Flight training will be conducted by the New Garden Flight Connection Flight School at the New Garden Flying Field in Toughkenamon, PA.

Subject to Board approval, two scholarships at \$2,000 each have been awarded annually.

1. For consideration of the annual flight training scholarship, applications need to be returned by the last day of April. The Scholarship Committee will notify the selected scholarship recipients by late May.

- 2. Please mail completed applications to: EAA Chapter 240. Attn: The Fred Kacena Flight Training Scholarship P.O. Box 240 Toughkenamon. PA 19374. Please do not leave applications at the Chapter Hangar, with a Chapter member, or at the airport. Mail services MUST be used. Incomplete, late or misdirected applications will not be accepted.
- 3. Applicants must be between the ages of 16 and 23 on the first day of June of the current year.
- 4. Applicants are required to be able to be vetted by the TSA regarding US citizenship.
- 5. Applicants are required to read, write and speak English to FAA standards.
- 6. Applicants must submit two letters of reference
- 7. Scholarship recipients are required to begin flight training by October 30, of the award year.
- 8. Successful applicants will provide 10 supervised volunteer hours to the Chapter operations.
- 9. Unused training funds remaining after 12 months of the award will be returned to EAA Chapter 240.
- 10. A scholarship recipient may apply and be awarded the scholarship for a maximum of two years.
- 11. Scholarship recipients are required to sign a Release of Liability form before any flight training will commence (for minors, the parent(s) or guardian(s) must sign).
- 12. There are three parts to this application: Please print the form and complete it legibly. Mail the original completed application with accompanying documents, to EAA Chapter 240 at the above address. If you would like to receive notification of receipt, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope when submitting your application. The notification of receipt will only verify we have received your application. It is your responsibility to make sure your application is complete.

The Fred Kacena Flight Training Scholarship - who was Fred Kacena?

Fred became interested in the Experimental Aircraft Association in the 1950's and was a founding member of Chapter 240 (EAA 240).

Over the years Fred earned numerous awards including the prestigious EAA Major Achievement Award. He was also a member of the OX-5 group and the QBs (Quiet Birdmen). After more than 60 years of dedicating his love to aviation, Fred retired in 2004 and passed away at the age of 89 in March of 2007. Chapter 240 (EAA 240) used a bequest from Fred to fund a scholarship in his memory for young people interested in learning to fly and deserving of financial assistance.

Fred was born in Cedar Rapids, IA, on August I, 1917. After high school, Fred joined the U.S. Army and honorably served his country during WWII. After the war, Fred became a PT-19 expert for the Air Corps Flight School in Uvalde, TX. In 1948 Fred and his family moved to Newark, DE where he began working as a control surface specialist for TWA. Fred later joined an atomic power research program at the University of Delaware while employed reconditioning Navy blimps in Elkton, MD.

Fred's next endeavor was an airplane shop at Lovett Airport in Elkton that his friends called "Fat Freddie's Fly Factory." He passed the Authorized Inspector examination for the FAA and later became shop foreman at Chester County Aviation. Fred acted on an opportunity at the FAA and spent the next 15 years commuting to the Baltimore Airport. In retirement Fred was given the responsibility of a Designated Area Representative (DAR) authorizing certification of amateur-built and restricted aircraft and to re-issue standard certificates for the FAA.

Fred's life was a testament to the dreams of any young aviator. He enjoyed wonderful experiences and personal achievement. At the EAA Chapter 240 it is our good fortune to honor Fred's passion for flight and engender that passion to the next generation.

Fred would be thrilled to see the success the EAA Chapter 240 Flight Training Scholarships have progressed in his name.
